SASKI is the non profit provincial sport governing body promoting all aspects of winter skiing In Saskatchewan.  
SASKI - Skiing for Disabled is a volunteer support network in SASKI that manages the Saskatchewan Disabled Ski Program.  
The Adaptive Equipment Inventory in Skiing for Disabled is available to its members to facilitate an economical, rewarding, and safe skiing experience. This service Is our way of helping to implement " Moving To Inclusion \* in Saskatchewan schools.

In addition to the adaptive equipment, we try to maintain a yearly updated provincial contact list of trained and qualified ski\* instructors, knowledgeable about adaptive equipment and the needs of skiers with disabilities. NOTE: Pre-arrangements must be made with the ski destination and SASKI - Staying for Disabled before any adaptive equipment is released to a destination. Local instructor fees are specific to each ski location, may vary widely, and arc not under control of Skiing for Disabled.

For any of our services, we specifically request:

- the user become a full member of one of the Saskatchewan Ski Association clubs ( for insurance & liability protection ) ;
- the user also become a member of CADS when alpine equipment is requested ;
- a needs assessment be conducted to determine the correct adaptive equipment;
- a (refundable) damage deposit be issued to "SASKI" for the requested equipment;
- establishing an advance rapport with management at chosen ski destination.

You are responsible for return of our equipment immediately after use ( for us to inspect ) in order to receive any damage deposit back. Remember this equipment is very costly, and some other child may be waiting to use it after you. We operate on a first-come, first-serve basis.

We thank you for your interest in this wonderful sport and making opportunities available to your students. We want to co-operate with you to ensure that ail our mutual objectives ( fun ; safety; affordability; dignity ) can be met We will respect all confidential information about individual students, but will share general statistics when requested as a courtesy. We value all your comments and constructive criticism, in order to make this type of service accessible and fair to all users. Help us to perfect it.
